Import conditions for Charolais Breeders New Zealand Society Ltd

Semen

A member may import semen from a sire registered in an approved overseas Herd Book with the object of approval for registration with the Society of any resultant progeny, provided the following items are supplied to the Society prior to registration of progeny of such sires in the Herd book:

Copy of the bull's pedigree for the five successive generations prior to and including the subject bull.

A SNP DNA profile file at greater or equal to 50K panel from a Society

approved DNA testing facility in the following format;

50K - final report format (.TXT or a ZIP folder of genotype files, containing AB alleles (not ATCG)

100K - final report format (.TXT or a ZIP folder of genotype files, containing AB alleles (not ATCG)

Myophosphoralyse - add-ons/genetic test result (ILR2 version or CSV in relevant format)

Progressive Ataxia - add-ons/genetic test result (ILR2 version or CSV in relevant format)

Parent Verification - PV result only (ILR2 version or CSV in relevant format)

The results of a negative Myophosphorylase Deficiency and clearly stated Progressive Ataxia test from a Society approved DNA testing facility.

Genomic data verifying both sire and dam from an approved testing facility.

A profile colour photograph of the bull, Council reserves the right to request further images of the bull;

Payment of the fee for International Sire application; and The bull must be duly registered with the Society.

The Society reserves the right to reject any sire that does not comply with the CBNZ Regulations and/or Breed Standards.

Embryos

The donor dam must be registered with the Charolais Society of

the country of origin and have a GGP-LD SNP DNA profile established;

The Donor dam must be registered in the CBNZ Herd Book and pay applicable registration fees.

The sire of an imported embryo must be registered as an Approved International Sire in CBNZ.

Live Animals We Do not believe this is possible as present.
