Niagara Falls Parks Power Station Guided Tour & Self Guided Tunnel Experience

Explore the first major power plant on the Canadian side of the Niagara River. Repurposed artifacts, interactive exhibits and interpretative installations offer a first-hand look at how this hydropower pioneer harnessed the power of water to generate electricity for 100 years. You'll "follow the flow" up close with a scale model of the plant.

From its iconic roof to the tunnels deep below ground, it's a remarkable demonstration of water to power. Then, roll up your sleeves and take control to learn first-hand how workers harnessed electricity every day at an interactive control panel.

After a 50–60-minute tour of the generator floor, guests will travel deep into the underground infrastructure of the building via a glass enclosed elevator, finishing their ride 180-feet below the main floor. Assiniboine Park Zoo

With over 80 acres to explore, the Zoo is open year-round with both indoor and outdoor exhibits, providing visitors with the opportunity to interact with animal species from all corners of the globe. The award-winning Journey to Churchill exhibit is the most comprehensive northern species exhibit of its kind in the world. Experience a variety of naturalistic landscapes, animal viewing areas, interpretive signage and interactive displays which invite visitors to learn about biodiversity, climate change and conservation. In Gateway to the Arctic, underwater viewing tunnels known as Sea Ice Passage give visitors the rare opportunity to view polar bears and seals swimming from below the surface of the water. Inglis Grain Elevators National Historic Site

The Inglis elevator row consists of five standard-plan, wooden grain elevators located alongside the former Canadian Pacific Railway track bed, in the village of Inglis, Manitoba. Because so many traditional country elevators have been demolished throughout Western Canada, the Inglis elevator row preserves rare examples of a formerly common sight from "the golden age of grain". In recognition of the elevators in Inglis being the last elevator row in Canada, they have been fully restored and protected as a National Historic Site of Canada.

Charolais breeders for 50 years, the Howe family hosts an annual bull sale with Rosso Charolais. They use effluent water for irrigation. There will be a host of breeders to greet you at displays followed by a steak supper.

Temple Gardens Mineral Spa, Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan (two nights)

The source of the geothermal water that has made Temple Gardens Hotel & Spa world-famous was discovered accidentally in 1910 when a deep well was bored to locate natural gas. In 1980, the City of Moose Jaw drilled a new geothermal well into porous foundations that was once an ancient seabed, providing Temple Gardens Hotel & Spa with its therapeutic mineral waters. Under its own pressure, the water travels through an insulated pipeline from the well-head located approximately 0.8 kilometers (1/4 mile) away. Geothermal heat from the much deeper molten mass of the earth's core continually warms the reservoirs of mineral water to a well-head temperature of about 45°C (113°F). The mineral water loses less than one degree as it passes through the insulated pipeline to the Spa. The chemistry of this geothermal mineral water is like the water used at the famous mineral pools in Bath, England. Its concentration is approximately 10,000 parts per million in total dissolved solids and it contains such compounds as Epsom and Glauber's Salts. The water also contains sodium, potassium, calcium, magnesium, chloride, bicarbonate, sulphate, boron, bromine, fluoride, silicon, and strontium as trace elements. The artesian well can produce 166 gallons per minute, ensuring that it remains a renewable resource.




